COMMISSIONER VACANCY: As only three of the four Commissioner positions were filled, ***there will be one vacant position.*** The newly elected members will fill this position by appointment at the January 2011 meeting. ***IF you are a resident interested in serving your City, please contact Mayor Evans.***

On November 18th, Mayor Evans, Commissioner McGee and Pat Gould, Clerk/Treasurer attended the Jefferson County League of Cities annual meeting. The guest speaker was Metro Mayor-elect, Greg Fischer. One primary issue we took away from his message, was that he and his staff want to 'bridge' the relationships and support between the Metro Government and small cities. Although Metro Government, and primarily Councilman Jim King for District 10, has always helped Parkway Village when they could, it is good to hear we can expect that to continue.

ANNUAL SANTA VISIT: Please be on the alert to see Santa riding thru our City on the Camp Taylor Fire Department truck sometime between December 14th and 16th some time after 5:30 p.m.

STREET INTERSECTIONS: Commissioner Lyle Janes is checking with companies for a cost to repaint the striping at the intersections. Although weather may be a factor, once we contract with a company and approve the expense, be looking for this safety enhancement to our streets.

SPEED HUMPS: At the September meeting, a request from a resident on Linwood to place speed humps on Linwood was presented. Representing a majority of the residents on Linwood, Ms. Miles presented an extremely well prepared statement and supporting research on this topic. In addition to Linwood, Commissioner Amshoff stated that residents on Packard Ave. are also requesting speed humps. Both Linwood and Packard are the two 'through' streets in our City and experience a higher volume of traffic with higher risk of speeding vehicles.

The Mayor and Board agreed to research the legal issues, expense and funding, and city liability before making a decision on this request. In the interim, Ms. Miles and Commissioner Amshoff have obtained the requirements for petitioning property owners on Linwood and Packard and acquire signatures to move forward.

At the November meeting, Pat Gould reported that Metro funds could not be used for our roadwork since we are an incorporated entity already receiving road funds from Kentucky. Further work will need to be done to determine exact costs, confirm legality and compliance of placement on our streets, as well as assuring the City retains sufficient funds for future street paving needs.

SNOW REMOVAL/ DE-ICING: We were notified by City of Audubon Park that their Public Works Department will not be renewing our snow removal contract, effective December 31, 2010. Therefore, we have been in the hunt to find a new provider. We have received some proposals and will continue to look into this in order to make an efficient decision. *IF you know of a reputable snow removal person/company please refer them to Mayor Evans as soon as possible.*

EASEMENT BETWEEN LINWOOD AND MELFORD: The clean up and retainment of a clear easement is crucial for the proper water flow and drainage for residents on Linwood and Melford. Residents are responsible for this and the City supports and appreciates those that do their part. However, we want to recognize Yvonne Miles, of Linwood Ave., for her personal hard work and effort in assuring this is done. Thanks Yvonne from the Mayor and Board!

BLOCK WATCH: The new Block Watch and No Trucks signs are in. Commissioner Paul Amshoff will be working on getting those installed, weather permitting.

The next Block Watch meeting is scheduled for January 15, 2011 at 11:00 a.m. at Audubon Park City Hall. All Captains and concerned residents are encouraged to attend.

REMINDER: Garbage cans may be placed in front yards of your own residence NO EARLIER than noon the day before pickup. Empty containers *MUST be removed from public view no later than noon the day AFTER pickup.*
