## COMPLIMENTARY CITY WIDE SAFETY-SECURITY INSPECTIONS

On Saturday April 10<sup>th</sup>, beginning at 10:00 a.m. .... members of the Camp Taylor Fire Department and officers of the Audubon Police Department will perform a citywide walk-through. Police and firefighters will go door-to-door and *offer* to provide: safety inspections, install smoke detectors, make visual surveys of your property and present you with security/safety suggestions and answer questions for the residents of Parkway Village. This public service is provided to improve residential safety and security. Home inspections are provided upon your permission to enter your premises.

**LG&E project:** A major gas line replacement project in Parkway Village and in surrounding areas has begun. Gas meters inside residences will be moved to exterior locations. Cuts into streets and sidewalks will be patched. Upon completion of the project, streets, sidewalks and landscaping will be restored to conform to pre-project conditions.

**VILLAGE GREEN PARK:** We have noticed an unhealthy amount of dog excrement in the park. For health and safety reasons, we will purchase and install a 'Doggie Waste' station in our park. Please be courteous pet owners and clean up any animal waste deposited while visiting the park, clean up the waste in your yard, and any left in your neighbors' yards while walking your pet. Carrying a couple plastic bags on the walk will help you clean up the waste.

We are aware of the need to clean off the graffiti on the park equipment. The chemicals we are hoping will remove the graffiti requires warmer temperatures and we will begin the clean up process soon. We ask you to contact Audubon Park Police should you witness any vandalism or have knowledge of persons involved in the vandalism.

## SEEKING RESIDENTS' INPUT - SUMMER FAIR

**CONSTRUCTION:** Any change of existing structure, such as an addition to the home, a garage, or fencing requires a letter of compliance from Parkway Village, before obtaining a Metro building permit. Please contact our City Clerk, Pat Gould for information.

**NEED POLICE:** City of Audubon Park Police may be contacted by calling the Sheriff's office at 574-5471; tell them you live in Parkway Village and need services from the Audubon Park police. As always, call 911 for life and death emergencies needing fire, police or EMS services.

An Audubon Park police officer often attends our monthly meetings. They continuously stress the importance of contacting them *immediately* should you observe or hear any suspicious activity.

## CITY OF PARKWAY VILLAGE BLOCK WATCH

Your Block Watch Captains continue to be engaged in this safety endeavor for our City. A meeting was held on Saturday March 13<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 a.m. at Audubon Park City Hall. The following topics were discussed:

- 1) The preferred method of communication between the Captain and his/her respective street residents is by email. However, there was minimal response when the Captains asked for contact information. Please be assured your information is not published or disbursed to anyone other than your Captain. Our goal is to provide prompt communication to you regarding concerns of interest and ability to contact you should something happen to your home while you are away. However, we understand that some residents may be more comfortable providing that information to a neighbor.
- 2) A design for a sign, to post throughout the City letting people know we are watching, was agreed upon. Preparing the final design and obtain pricing is the next step.

Captain Curtis of the Audubon Police Department offered the following:

- 1) Please do NOT ever hesitate to call the police at the time an incident occurs or you observe or hear any suspicious activity. This is repeated in our quarterly Newsletter and your prompt action is appreciated by the Police. Reporting an incident after the fact is not conducive to the security in our City. Be assured, you do not have to give your name and if you do...it is not divulged.
- 2) If you plan to be away from your home for an extended period of time, inform Audubon Police and they will provide a walk around inspection of your home while you are away.
- 3) He had no major incidents to report. There have been minimal break-ins at some businesses along Preston. No residential break-ins reported. The cold weather has been a deterrent to crime. As the weather breaks, more people will be out.....please stay alert and report to the police any observation of suspicious persons or activity.

Everyone agreed the success to this endeavor is the participation of our residents. The meeting dates and information of interest will be posted on our website.
